DOCUMENTS & REQUIREMENTS

- ☐ APS certificate — Academic evaluation required for some nationalities.
- ☐ Blocked account (Sperrkonto) — Proof of funds (~€11,904/year) for the study visa.
- ☐ uni-assist application — Centralised application & credential check.
- ☐ Language certificate — TestDaF/DSH for German-taught; IELTS/TOEFL for English-taught.
- ☐ Degree & transcripts (certified translation + apostille) — Certified translations of diploma and records.
- ☐ Health insurance — Statutory cover (TK, AOK, Barmer) before enrolment.

- ☐ Shortlist universities & Bachelor's programs
- ☐ Check equivalency / Studienkolleg needs
- ☐ Confirm requirements & deadlines
- ☐ Prepare & translate school certificates
- ☐ Sit required language / admission tests
- ☐ Submit applications & accept an offer
- ☐ Arrange proof of funds & apply for the visa

- ☐ Estimated living cost: €950 / month
- ☐ Visa fee: €75

- ☐ Practice: What are your plans after graduation?
- ☐ Practice: Why this university and city?

BEFORE YOU GO

- ☐ Book your flight (arrive before enrolment)
- ☐ Activate statutory health insurance
- ☐ Find accommodation (dorm or WG-Gesucht)

AFTER YOU ARRIVE

- ☐ City registration (Anmeldung) within 14 days
- ☐ Open a bank account
- ☐ Book the residence-permit appointment
- ☐ Get a German SIM card

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
